People: Poor supervision	12	M	Signed off and checked during use, Use a sign for communication	4	2 supervisors over 18 years or older, per 15 participants Have extra supervision for participants that are waiting when required to safely run the activity Communicate with other supervisor using clear hand signals and visual clarification. Two arms up in a Y shape with thumbs up as a go visual and arms across chest in X shape as a no visual.	Yes

People: Misuse of equipment	10	E	Do not leave gear unattended, and teach correct use of equipment	5	Supervisors must supervise participants at all times and must not leave equipment unattended. All equipment must be fitted and used correctly.	Yes
People: Kayaks and dismount step in the path of flying fox	9	M	Have rope up separating areas Dismount supervisor to ensure dismount step is not in path	3	Make sure line is clear including objects in the water and that there are no obstructions on the steps or at the dismount end Do not go over rope on kayak/PB SOPs	Yes
Environment: Uneven track Slippery Stairs	9	M	On daily and monthly check list Water blast when slippery, clear when obstacles exist, and fill in muddy spots with rounded metal to prevent slipping hazard	2	-	Yes
People: Impairment of Supervisor	6	E	CYC Staff to look out for signs of impairment	3	-	Yes

<b>Equipment</b>	15 harnesses, 3 pulleys with back up, 1 safety rope, pole, crates and offload rope Activity SOPs Rescue Equipment available in Gym & Office (but to only be used by CYC Instructors)
<b>Competencies for Activity Sign Off</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Be able to manage a group of participants 2:15</li><li>• Follow the Activity SOPs</li><li>• Looking out for unsafe actions</li><li>• Know where to get help/locate CYC Staff or group organizers</li><li>• Demonstrate correct use of Flying Fox gear- Harnesses, Pulley, Karabiners, Straps</li><li>• Demonstrate correct procedures</li><li>• Read and understand Instructions</li><li>• Observe instructor for 2 participants</li><li>• Be observed by instructor for 3 participants</li></ul>
<b>Final decision on implementing activity</b>	<b>ACCEPTED by CYC Director</b>
<b>Comments</b>	Circumstances can change quickly, supervisors need to be diligent in their task, and respond as needed.
