If you can't see the stream, you've gone too far Once you reach the fork in the stream head left towards wooden bridge, once on the path walk left towards camp, stay to track and don't deviate	Yes

People: Lost person	9	E	Head count to be done before and after activity	3	2 Activity Supervisors over 16 years old, per 15 participants Covered shoes must be worn. They will get wet. There must be a competent supervisor who is leading the activity Do a head count before and after canyoning	Yes
People: Impairment of Supervisor	6	E	CYC Staff to look out for signs of impairment	3	-	Yes
